All these pathways are in great condition and clearly marked. However, if you want to discover the park by yourself be sure to get onto the paths

and away from the main roads. You will find the nicest hidden spots, where you will be able to see the wildlife and incredible old giant pine and yew trees. This forest is one of the only three remaining yew tree forests in Europe. The mild Atlantic climate also provides the perfect environment for mosses and ferns. That is why these woodlands look so enchanting just like in Tolkien's books.

Other walkers in the park are friendly and say "Hello". If you are alone, security concerns are not an issue.



The National park is home to wild red deer, which are one of the highlights and unique in Ireland. You will see these beautiful animals within the surrounding hills and woodlands. Now the herd's number is approximately 600. If you want to study the deer in details it is good to have a pair of binoculars.
